


IGCS – Strategic Alliance

- Started in March, 2017
- Formed alliances with Regional Societies and groups whose mission and objectives are aligned with the IGCS
- These partnerships bring together the leaders and members of related organizations allowing for better collaboration to address Gynecologic Oncology challenges globally




IGCS

- There is a significant shortage of health care providers in regions of the world with high cervical cancer rates
- Many regions do not have specialty training in gynecologic oncology
- Critical need to train and educate local physicians to address the epidemic of rising rates of cancer globally, particularly in LMICs

Global Curriculum & Mentorship Program

- A two-year Gynecologic Oncology training and education program for regions without formal training:
 - Web-based curriculum that can be modified by sites
 - Match institutions and individuals from programs in regions with formal Gynecologic Oncology training with partners in regions without (twinning)
 - Goal: train 1 to 2 fellows per year
 - In collaboration with local hospital, University and MOH



Global Curriculum & Mentorship Program

- Local mentor
- International mentor(s)
- Monthly meetings between fellow(s) and mentors
 - · Review of curriculum (donated textbooks), Multiple Choice Questions
- Monthly tumor board (Project ECHO)
- International mentor(s) visits site minimum >2x/year
- Fellow spends 1-3 months at international mentoring site
- Final exam (written, oral and practical)
- Certificate (not certification)

- Fellow visits the international mentoring site
 - Supported by the IGCS
- Opportunity to gain additional exposure to:
 - Radiation Oncology
 - Pathology
 - Multi-disciplinary care
 - Minimally invasive surgery
 - Research/Clinical Trials




Research


Making Cancer History®

Virtual Tumor Board

- Occur monthly
- Last one hour:
 - 45 minutes of case presentations
 - 15 minute didactic lecture
- Local providers present de-identified patient cases and receive feedback from international experts (includes Pathology & Rad
