



- Progress?






- Knowledge about infectious cause (HPV) and control.






Unique opportunity: natural history








Conditions for effective cervical cancer prevention and control:

- Palliative care






How to make progress in CX control?

- Vaccines and medicines










Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) 2012: HPV included into GAVI portfolio.






National and International Commitments

- World Heath Assembly: WHO NCD Action Plan targets and indicators (cervical cancer screening) (2014)
- Union for the Mediterranean: WoRTH*
 Project approved by UfM Board (2016)
- *Women's Right to Health: access to cervical cancer screening






Cervical Cancer (HPV) eradication = utopic ?

- Eradication possible if:
 - Agent confined to humans,
 - Effective intervention (vaccine) to interrupt transmission,
 - Life-long immunity.






Cervical Cancer (HPV) eradication = utopic ?

- Political Will (e. g. Rwanda, Australia)
- Resources, Partnerships
- Delivery systems (Vaccine + Screening)
