


HPV Testing and Screening: Current Status & Future – The arabic Perspective

Objective


 To evaluate the knowledge of Lebanese women concerning the Human Papillomavirus (HPV), its implication in cervical cancer as well as the screening methods and vaccination

 To measure the pap smear and HPV vaccination uptake and to determine the factors influencing them in the same population


Methods

- We have recruited randomly Lebanese women over 18 years old, residing in the greater Beirut area and with no medical history
- 444 women were asked to fill out a questionnaire
- The questionnaire was composed of 20 questions evaluating their knowledge about HPV and cervical cancer




SOURCE OF INFORMATION ABOUT CERVICAL CANCER




HAVE HEARD OF HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS






AGE WOMEN ARE MOST SUSCEPTIBLE TO INFECTION BY HPV










HAVE HEARD OF A TEST TO DIAGNOSE INFECTION BY HPV









HAVE HEARD OF A VACCINATION TO PREVENT INFECTION BY HPV







PAP SMEAR UPTAKE IN LEBANON COMPARED TO OTHER COUNTRIES



Screening

 Screening was significantly associated with cervical cancer awareness and regular visits to a gynecologist (p<0.001)

Vaccination

 Vaccination uptake was significantly associated with religion (p = 0.021), profession (p = 0.03) and regular visits to a gynecologist (p = 0.022)

 Only 11.7% of participants aged between 18 to 26 years were vaccinated against HPV

Conclusion

- Lebanese women are not well informed about HPV and cervical cancer
- Screening by Pap smear and HPV vaccination uptakes are nonsatisfactory
- Further interventions are required in order to improve these numbers
