Representatives from sixteen GCIG trial groups met to define and discuss our role as a pathology liaison group.

Pathology Clinical Trial (PaCT) Group: A GCIG liaison

The mission of the Pathology Clinical Trial (PaCT) Group is to serve as a resource for improving the pathologic and molecular guidelines used in GCIG clinical trials. The PaCT Group is composed of gynecologic pathologists from international GCIG member groups who are interested in incorporating standardized pathologic and molecular classification into clinical trial design. This resource is meant to be a supplement to pathologists already engaged in specific clinical trials in individual GCIG member groups. PaCT Group encourages increased participation of pathologists in review of materials for clinical trials, preferably in a prospective manner.

Specific aims include:

1. Publication of tumour and organ specific guidelines for pathologic parameters to be addressed in clinical trial design (Trial specific pathology manual).
2. Organization of an international network of gynecologic pathologists available for clinical trial review and consultation.
3. Review and facilitate new clinical trial proposals from the pathologic perspective.
4. Introduction of possible new pathology or molecular based clinical trials.

The chair of the group is David Millan who is the current ISGyP liaison to GCIG.
